## **ADULT FAITH FORMATION—FAQS**

#### Why do Catholics mark their forehead, lips and heart before the reading of the Gospel?

When the Gospel is about to be read, the priest says: 'A Reading from the Gospel according to St. \_\_\_\_.' The congregation then responds, 'Glory to You Oh Lord,' making a small cross with their thumb over their forehead, lips, and heart.

The reason for making a cross during this period of the Mass is to highlight the importance of the Word of God we are about to hear. We make a cross on our forehead to indicate we believe the Gospel. The cross on our lips is to indicate that we profess the words of the Gospel and the cross over our hearts is to indicate we *love* the word of God.


