





RE-OPENING FOR PUBLIC MASS

Bishop Knestout and the offices of the Diocese have shared that the suspension of Masses is lifted beginning with the Vigil Mass this Saturday, May 23, 2020, with approval of a parish reopening plan which SEAS has received. In accord with the direction of the governor, public worship will begin with a 50% capacity limit, maintaining 6 feet from other people (as defined by the CDC) by all gathered. **Guidelines:**

Face coverings-All present for the liturgy ages 3 and older must wear face coverings, as recommended by the CDC, WHO and Governor of Virginia when present for any Mass or liturgical celebration.

Vulnerable category—Those in the vulnerable category (65+ adults, people who are immunocompromised) are encouraged to remain home as per CDC and the governor recommendations.

Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass—Due to the capacity limit for liturgies which limits the number of faithful who can attend Mass and recognizing that those in the vulnerable category should remain home, Bishop Knestout dispenses all of the faithful of the Diocese of Richmond from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days until further notice.

Recorded Mass—will continue to be offered on our Facebook and web page for the present time.

Additional Considerations:

Seating—Families/households will be seated on one side and individuals on the other, every other pew to maintain distancing.

Mass times—Please note we have adjusted Mass times on Sundays to 8:30 AM and 11:30 AM to allow enough time between for proper exiting and sanitizing between Masses. We ask that you arrive 30 minutes prior to the start of Mass to allow time to be seated.

Church Entrance Ouestions—Prior to entrance, a usher will ask 3 questions: Have you or anyone in your household had a fever in the past 2 weeks? Do you or anyone in your household have a new cough or shortness of breath?
