

NUN RUN FOOD DONATIONS

Items donated for the monthly Nun Run help support two communities of women religious, the Poor Clare Nuns and the Little Sisters of St. Francis. Each has a different but vital role in the Church.

The Poor Clares are vegetarian but eat fish twice a week. They can use canned veggies, fruit, rice, flour, salt, canned tuna and salmon as well as toothpaste, paper products and soap.

The Little Sisters of St. Francis appreciate canned foods, gelatin desserts, puddings and soups, as well as paper products, laundry detergent, disinfectant wipes and non-latex gloves for providing personal hygiene to the mentally and physically handicapped residents they care for. They can also use towels and wash cloths for bathing the residents.

On the first weekend of each month, there is a collection for both communities: **Next date, Oct. 1/2.**

SYNOD UPDATE

The Catholic Diocese of Richmond completed its report for the ongoing Synod of Bishops for 2021-2023. The theme for this worldwide event is synodality itself: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission."

Synodality can be summed up as "walking together." The Synod of Bishops is intended to help the Universal Church come together to listen, reflect, discern and discuss where God is leading us, not to change the doctrine, but instead help each individual carry out the mission of the Universal Church.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish had consultative parish-wide discussions back in March, and the summarized results were incorporated into the larger diocesan report, which can be accessed at:

The diocesan synthesis will become part of the report submitted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as the worldwide synod continues its consultations.
