Virtus Account Inactivations

We are most grateful to all those volunteers who have worked to maintain their *Virtus* accounts and keep up with their monthly training bulletins. In an effort to follow-up on background screenings for volunteers in an efficient manner, the Office of Safe Environment is instituting a new action plan. They have asked *Virtus* to inactivate all users who fall into either of the two categories: users with no background screening recorded and who have not logged into their *Virtus* accounts since October 1, 2021 and users with expired screenings (8/1/17 and earlier) and have not logged into their *Virtus* accounts since October 1, 2021.

All users affected by this action will be notified by email from *Virtus* and will be informed to contact the parish for re-activation if needed. Thank you.


