# **BLESSING OF THE ADVENT** WREATH THIS WEEKEND

The blessing of the Advent wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.

Traditionally, three candles are violet and the fourth is rose colored, although four violet or white candles may be used.

The candles represent the four weeks of Advent, with the candle lit each week in accord with the current week of Advent. The rose candle is lit on the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday.
