JUBILEE PILGRIMAGE SITES WITHIN THE **DIOCESE OF RICHMOND**

Bishop Barry C. Knestout has designated four pilgrimage sites in the Diocese of Richmond for the Jubilee Year of 2025:

Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, Richmond Basilica of Saint Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Norfolk **Basilica of Saint Andrew, Roanoke** National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, Williamsburg

- Additionally, the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., is another local jubilee site that provides a beautiful, prayerful location for a pilgrimage.
- The idea of pilgrimages and indulgences is central to jubilee years. For the Jubilee of Hope, participation in a pilgrimage to one of the local sites enables one to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence.
- To obtain the indulgence, a pilgrimage can be made individually, or as a group, to any of the designated Jubilee sites, both within the diocese and outside of it. Once at the Jubilee site, the pilgrim would participate in one of the following options:
- 1. Mass
- **2.** *Liturgy of the Word*

3. Eucharistic adoration (to conclude with an Our Father, Profession of Faith, and *Invocation to Mary*)

- 4. Penitential celebration ending in individual confession
- 5. Liturgy of the Hours
- 6. Stations of the Cross
- 7. Praying the rosary
- **8**. *Recitation of the Akathist Hymn*

An indulgence would be granted if the pilgrim, who is in a state of grace, makes the pilgrimage, participates in one of the above options, receives Holy Communion, and prays for the intentions of Pope Francis (while having the intention to obtain the indulgence).




